Eastern Region Profile

Delta Dental of Kentucky partnered with Kentucky Youth Advocates and the University of Louisville School of Dentistry through the Delta Dental of Kentucky Making Smiles Happen® initiative to conduct a new statewide survey of children's oral health. Dentists were sent to 60 schools across five regions of the state to directly observe the mouths of 3rd and 6th graders. Parents were also asked about family oral health history, collecting data for over 2,000 students. The result is a long overdue picture of children's oral health in Kentucky - the last survey prior to this initiative was completed in 2001.

EASTERN REGION AT A GLANCE

- The Eastern region had the greatest need for urgent dental care, nearly 20% of children.
- The rate of untreated cavities was significantly greater in the Eastern region, where more than half of 3rd and 6th graders - roughly 15,200 children - had untreated cavities.
- The Eastern region saw the largest decline in the number of children without sealants.
- Parents in the Eastern region cited pain and previous conditions as the reason for their child's last dental visit with greater frequency than those in other regions.

Children who have experienced tooth decay are at greater risk of having future tooth decay. These numbers have worsened since the 2001 survey.





Sealants can help prevent the need for early or urgent dental care.










